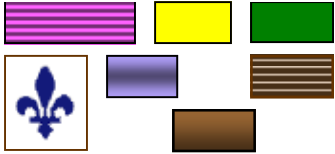

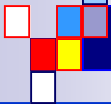

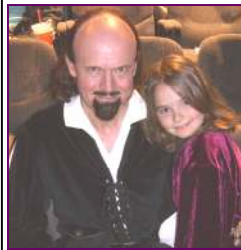
Springtime with Shakespeare
